


DINE-OUT

Did you know, St. Jacobus Evangelical Lutheran Church is the oldest public building in the Folsom Borough. St. Jacobus was the first church, the first school and the first meeting place for all social and town meetings.

In between 1845 and 1850 about 40 families had emigrated from Germany to what is now known as the town of Folsom, named after Frances Folsom, the wife of President Grover Cleveland. The settlers made their new home along a short, two mile stretch of land beside the old stage coach route, Long A Coming Trail. The settlers bought 25 acres (sold for \$1.00 an acre) to build their farms from the estate of Samuel Richards. After the families had arrived to their new home, they wanted a place to worship in their native language. For five years the new settlers would form a congregation and hold services at the homes of their fellow members. Not long after, Stephen Colwell and Walter Bell (the heirs of the Richards estate, whom they purchased their farmland from), gave the people of New Germany a grant of two acres to build a church and school. This church would be founded as St. Jacobus Lutheran Evangelical Congregation, and "with the help of God and contributions from congregation and Christian friends"

their Church was assembled and held 32 communicants.


