### **Thoughts from Pastor**

As I have been doing our Grief Support Group, I realize how difficult it is for people to not only grieve, but how difficult it is for those around them. Grief is so often misunderstood. I want to share information over the next few newsletters to help us be better companions for those who are grieving.

First we will look at Myths and Facts about Grief.

Myth: Ignoring the pain of the loss helps it to go away faster.

FACT: Ignoring the pain or keeping it from surfacing actually makes it worse in the long run. Healing occurs as one faces the grief and actively deals with it.

Myth: It's important to be "be strong" in the face of loss.

FACT: Feeling sad, frightened or lonely is a normal reaction to loss. Crying doesn't mean one is weak. One does not need to "protect" family or friends by putting on a brave front. Showing true feelings can help everyone move through grief.

Myth: If one doesn't cry, it means one is not sorry about the loss.

FACT: Crying is a normal response to sadness, but not the only one. Those who don't cry feel the pain just as deeply as others. They simply have other ways of showing it.

Myth: Grief should last about a year.

FACT: There is no time frame for grieving. It is experienced for as long as it is experienced.

Myth: Moving on with one's life means one is forgetting the one you lost.

FACT: Moving on means one has accepted the loved one's death. This is not the same as forgetting. The loved one's memory can be held while a new life is created.

Myth: It is best not to bring up the person who died and things about them.

FACT: People who are grieving usually want and need to talk about their loss. Bringing up the subject can make it easier to talk about.





Imagine how lonely and homesick the people of New Germany were. They were so delighted and thankful that they finally had a true place to worship in their native tongue

like their forefather's. Following many failed attempts to secure a regular ordained Preacher, their wish was finally granted with the help of the Evangelical Lutheran Synod of Pennsylvania, after they helped St. Jacobus obtain A.G. Georgin (who was currently a Preacher in Camden) to offer his services as Pastor to the St. Jacobus congregation. Now remember, in 1852, there were no roads, only a dirt trail leading from Camden to New Germany. He actually had to ride his horse every Sunday about 30 miles to preach.

On Sunday, May 7th, the Church was dedicated to the service of the Triune God. The congregants had an extraordinary festival. Their aspirations and prayers were fulfilled. Thanksgiving had flowed that God had helped them worship in their new country and home in the same way as their forefathers. They knew this day would always remain a blessed memory. Pastor A.G. Georgin delivered a beautiful sermon, the message of the sermon was the Epistle of Jude which



included verse Jude 21:1 "Keep yourselves in the love of God; wait for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ, until eternal life, and convince some, who doubt". In the afternoon the cemetery was dedicated with a separate, appropriate and just as beautiful speech. April 22, 2023 3 pm - 6 pm
