### Thoughts from Pastor

As we continue to look at how we can care for one another at the time of grief I share the following article by Dr. Alan D. Wolfelt, Ph.D. He gives these Eleven Tenets of Companioning the Bereaved. They are helpful in understanding the best way we can be there for others.

- 1. Companioning is about being present to another person's pain; it is not about taking away the pain.
- Companioning is about going to the wilderness of the soul with another human being; it is not about thinking you are responsible for finding the way out.

- 3. Companioning is about honoring the spirit; it is not about analyzing with the head.
- Companioning is about listening with the heart; it is not about analyzing with the head.
- 5. Companioning is about bearing witness to the struggles of others; it is not about judging or directing these struggles.
- 6. Companioning is about walking alongside; it is not about leading.
- 7. Companioning is about discovering the gifts of sacred silence; it does not mean filling up every moment with words.
- 8. Companioning is about being still; it is not about frantic movement forward.
- Companioning is about respecting disorder and confusion; it is not about imposing order and logic.
- 10. Companioning is about learning from others; it is not about teaching them.
- 11. Companioning is about compassionate curiosity; it is not about expertise.

As you can see, it is about honoring and respecting the person where they are and allowing them to heal in their own timing.

# History of St. James, continued from Feb Newsletter

St. Jacobus Evangelical Lutheran Church was finally built and dedicated in 1852. The church was constructed as a small rectangular shaped building with the most beautiful setting of an oak forest that sheltered it from the North wind for over a century. The foundation was masonry, with beautiful handmade shingles that were crafted by one of the original members at their sawmill. The settlers were overjoyed that they now had a place to worship, but a new necessity evolved. Their children needed an education; they needed a school. St. Jacobus was the only public building, so not only was the church a place of worship, but it was also home to a new school. Descendants of the New Germany settlers told the story: Children attended school Monday through Friday. On Friday, after school, the students would push back their moveable seats, sweep the floor, and clean the room. The pews and other fixtures were put in order, and the church was ready for Sunday services. Men governed the church as they followed traditional customs. During worship men sat on the right side of the church, and women sat on the left (the same went for the children while in school). During communion, men were called upon first. Despite these customs, the women of New Germany took an active role in the many services and events of the church; they also always provided marvelous encouragement, support, and of course delicious food when the men were busy with construction on the church.
